It particularly targets Latin America, China and India as well as growing markets in the black and lesbian and gay populations.

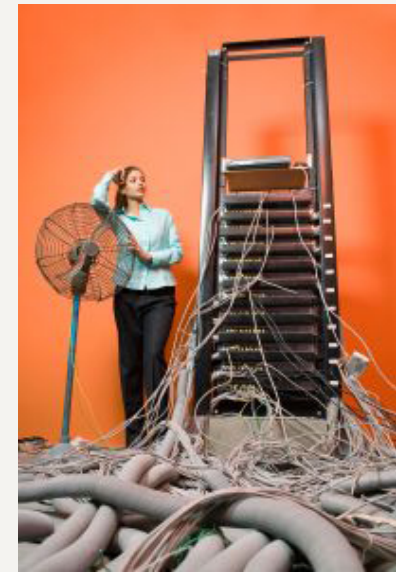
